MANAGERS' CORNER

Welcome back to some of our Snow Birds! We certainly missed you and are glad to see you. You missed a hot steamy summer here (and you might have had one where you were too), but no matter, we are looking forward to a wonderful fall season -when it decides to come.

THANKSGIVING: I want to wish you all a Happy Thanksgiving. It is hard to believe it is that time of year already. May we focus on the things that we have and be thankful for each and every day. I appreciate being the Manager for Hawaiian Village and may you all be able to spend more time with your family and friends. The office will be closed $\frac{1}{2}$ day on Wednesday, the 27^{th} and Thursday and Friday, November 28-29, 2019. Here is an easy recipe I ran across that you may want to try.

EASY FALL APPLE CAKE:

1 Box yellow or spice cake mix (the mix only)

1 can (21 oz.) apple pie filling

4 eggs

Preheat oven to 350. Spray a 9×13 dish with cooking spray & set aside. Combine all the ingredients with a mixer until thoroughly combined. The mixer will help break up the apple pieces. Pour into prepared dish.

Bake 35-40 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center tests clean. Allow cake to cool slightly before serving. Serve

with sweetened whipped cream with a sprinkle of cinnamon if desired.
