Please make sure you review the attached sheet to secure your home while away.

Also, please contact the office to let me know when you leave so that I can update our system. We try to maintain accurate records as to who is in the park in the event of an emergency. You can swing by or call (941) 755-6103 to let me know. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. "Aloha"!

METER READING: As a reminder, please keep the area around your water meter free and clear of <u>ALL</u> obstacles such as bushes, shrubs, and other materials. Please check to make sure yours is clear.

TOBACCO PRODUCTS: Please stop disposing of your cigarette butts along the streets and in the bushes. You would not want those all over your yard, so please show respect your own community by disposing of them properly. I get lots of complaints and am usually told it is "Not Me". It is unsightly and devalues the property. Your cooperation is appreciated.

HOME APPEARANCE: THANK YOU! THANK YOU! to those who are power washing your homes, painting your drive ways, and weeding. I know this is the time of year when it is really noticed and the power washing should be done annually. We still have quite a few homes in the park that are in need of attention. Don't forget the awnings! Please take care of any of the following if they apply to you.

* Weeds * Broken Windows * Old screening/or ripped screening *Pressure Washing &/or Painting homes and drive ways * Clutter under carports and in particular behind your homes. Please review Section F under the Rules and Regulations to see if you are in violation.

PETS: Our pets are a blessing to us and enrich our lives. I must remind you that with the privilege of having them comes staying within the guidelines of the Rules and Regulations. I have received quite a few complaints that several residents are not keeping their pets on a leash, not picking up after them and leaving them in a location where they bark excessively. This is all documented in Section G:31. Please review but here is a portion of it:

 a. All pets must be registered with the Community Office. All dogs and cats must be licensed & vaccinated.
 Copies of those documents must be filed with the Community Office.

- b. Pets must be restrained on a hand-held leash. Pets may not be "tied out" without proper supervision. Pets are not permitted on other residents' lots or on Common Ground at any time. Pets may be walked on the Community streets ONLY and residents MUST pick up any droppings immediately and deposit them in their own trash receptacles upon returning home.
- c. ".....Any pet which becomes a noise nuisance, is vicious, destructive or causes any disturbance shall not be allowed to remain in the Community." It is your responsibility to be in control of your pet and not leave them where they will bark excessively.

LOST & FOUND: A watch was turned in to me in January. Please contact me if you are missing one. Also, a drone was found on someone's driveway; contact me if you think it could be yours.

MISSING ITEMS: I have recently heard of several items being missing from a yard. So, please make sure to lock your car and bicycles up and put away anything of value. We do have security and the sheriff are providing coverage in our community as well, but they don't catch everything. You may want to invest in a security camera. Some of them are quite reasonable.

MISSING MAIL: Occasionally the mailmen puts someone else's mail in your box. Please don't throw it away. If it has their name on it, you can put in the mail to be redelivered or you can just take it to your neighbor. We have 8 streets that have houses with the same number and many times a substitute

mailman(woman) will not pick up on that. Please be respectful of someone else's privacy and let's be neighborly.
