<u>WHAT'S NEW:</u> The shuffleboard courts have been resurfaced with new bumpers! I was excited to get that done and hope you like it and that we have a lot of new players this season! The equipment is located inside the door outside near the dog park and the numeric code is: 6103

Also, we finally got a cover over the mailboxes! I was really excited to have that as well! We've all been patient in waiting for that one! Thank you for your patience!

<u>BUILDING ACCESS</u>: To enter the pool, Recreation Hall, and Club House you must have a key FOB. You can obtain one in the office as you will need to sign for it and have it activated to correspond with your name. Each household gets one free FOB. To obtain a replacement or a 2nd FOB, the cost is \$15.00.

<u>HOURS</u>: The pool hours are from 8:00 am until 10:00 pm. The Rec Hall and Club House hours are from 6:00 AM to 9:00 PM and you can access it using a Key Fob. A spray bottle of disinfectant and paper towels are provided for you to wipe down the areas you have touched. Also, please do not wear wet bathing suits in the Rec Hall or Club House and shirts and shoes are required.

DIRECTORIES: Anita has passed out the new directories. If you have not received one, please see Anita.

<u>HURRICANE INFO:</u> We are just about through Hurricane season, (and like you, I am very thankful we have been spared thus far), but just in case you have never received information on what to do or would just like to have it for reference, you can swing by the office to pick up a pamphlet or look on the bulletin board.

<u>GUEST PETS:</u> This is a friendly reminder that guests who bring their pets must adhere to our community Rules and Regulations pertaining to pets. This applies to weight limit as well as keeping on a leash and picking up their pet waste. Our Rules and Regulations also apply to your guests' pets. Please contact me with any questions.

NEW TELEPHONE DIALING PROCEDURE: The FCC has made some new changes to our dialing which will go into effect October 24th, 2021. To complete all LOCAL calls, you will need to dial the area code + telephone number. This includes all calls within your area code that are currently dialed with 7 digits. (* Some states may use 1 + area code + phone number). Beginning October 24, 2021, if you only dial the 7 digits, your call will not be completed. You will have to hang up and redial using the area code with the 7-digit number. (In some cases, you will need to add a 1 in front of the area code.) *In addition, all services, automatic dialing equipment or other types of equipment that are programmed to complete calls with just 7 digits will need to be reprogramed to include the area code. Examples include: any medical monitoring devices, fire or burglar alarms, fax machines, security systems, speed dialers, wireless phone contact lists, and similar functions. Don't forget to update your personal contact information including your pet ID tags to ensure the area code in included.

TEST SMOKE / CARBON DIOXIDE DETECTORS: Now is a good time to check your detectors which should have a "test" button. If the alarm sounds, all is good. If not, replace batteries immediately and test again. If it still doesn't sound, it's possible there's simply corrosion on the battery terminal, and it won't detect new batteries. Clean it and try again. If it still doesn't work, replace it.

<u>SPEED & STOP SIGNS:</u> As a reminder, the speed limit is 15 MPH and we have stop signs at every intersection. We have had several people out walking their dogs and a car was speeding and did not stop at the stop sign forcing them to jump into the yard. Please stop at the stop signs. I would hate for you to be involved in an accident that could be avoided. Please be respectful of the community regulations and your neighbors who walk.

LAWNS & HOUSE KEEPING: Now is the time to please take care of "outside housekeeping". We have had lots of rain and the weeds are flourishing. Please weed not only your flower beds, but along the side and especially the BACKS of your home. Some homes are in need of painting. Some drive ways are also in need of painting. Also, some have vinyl windows that have ripped and need replacing. We have had quite a few homes that have updated their homes with new paint and/or new driveways. They really look nice. Thank you to those residents who are taking pride in their homes and helping our community to look great! However, there are still quite a few that are not in compliance. Please contact me if you are unable to do this task and I can provide you with a name and number of someone who will do it for a fee.

Also, please take some time to clear your carports from unnecessary clutter. If you have quite a bit to be thrown out, contact Manatee County Utility Dept. (MCUD - 941-792-8811) as they will pick up a large amount once a year for free. If you need assistance in moving or discarding items, please let me know. You will feel so much better!!

SMOKERS: If you smoke, please discard your butts into a proper receptacle and do not throw them on the streets or grounds. I have had a lot of complaints and it is unsightly. I appreciate your cooperation.

Easy Cake Mix Pumpkin Bread



(Only 2 ingredients)

1 Box of Spice Cake Mix
1 15 oz. can of pumpkin
Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In large
bowl, combine the pumpkin puree and the
spice cake mix. Be careful not to
overmix. Spray a loaf pan with nonstick
spray or line with parchment paper. Pour
into the pan. Bake for 40-45 minutes until
a toothpick inserted in the center comes
out clean.

Options: Can add some nuts, chocolate chips or raisins.

If you use a white or yellow cake mix, just add a tsp. of cinnamon or pumpkin pie spice.


